Change Anyone?

Is there something about yourself you'd like to change? You're realizing that it would be in your best interest if you could change some of the ways you're thinking or feeling or something you're doing.

Personal change may involve our inner selves (deep feelings, beliefs, wishes, or fears) or our external behaviors (habits or decisions or relationships with others), or both. Change is often about personal growth, and that's always a good thing.

In my reading and research, I've learned a few things about personal change I'd like to share with you. Personal change is often a process of moving from Unconscious Incompetence ("I don't know what I don't know.") to Conscious Incompetence ("I know what I don't know.") to Conscious Competence ("I'm learning.") to Unconscious Competence ("I know it and do it – it's become automatic.")

The obvious question is how to do it. How can I go about making some necessary changes in myself?

I'm currently reading a book about that by Christian Jarrett (<u>Be Who You Want: Unlocking the Science of Personality Change</u>, New York: Simon & Shuster, 2021). I'd like to share some insights from this book. Researchers at the University of Zurich have discovered three basic principles of an evidence-based approach to personal change.

The first is a willingness and intention to change. That will most likely come from your values and life-goals – what and who in your life is most important to you. So it can be rewarding and effective to ask yourself, "What matters most to me?" or even "Who do I want to be?"

The second is a belief that you are capable of achieving the change you want. Do you have a "growth mind-set"? Is learning and growing important to you in your life? Research shows that inherited personality traits are a little like factory settings: yes, they incline you to act in certain ways, but with effort, commitment, and the right strategies, they can certainly be changed.

The third principle is the necessity of persistence with your behavioral changes until they become habitual. You must realize that change takes time and that it might be uncomfortable for a while. New ways of behaving take conscious effort at first, but through repetition, they can become easier and then

more automatic – just like learning to ride a bike.

Jarrett also shares ten rules for personal change, and here they are:

TEN RULES FOR PERSONAL CHANGE

- ① Successful change is more likely if it's for a larger purpose.
- ② You won't improve unless you appraise yourself honestly.
- ③ Real change begins with action.
- 4 Initiating change is easy. Sticking with it is the hard part.
- ⑤ Change is an ongoing process, and you need to keep track of it.
- ⑥ You need to be realistic about the amount of change that is possible.
- Tou're more likely to succeed with the help of others.
- ® Life will get in the way. The trick is to anticipate and roll with it.
- Self-kindness is more likely to lead to lasting change than beating yourself
 up.
- Believing in the potential for and continuing nature of personality change is a philosophy to live by.

As a Christian, I also find it helpful to remember the gift of Baptism – how we've been "born anew" (John 3:3) and "have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:27). That means dying to an old way of being and being born into a new way of being. God gives me, in my Baptism, the capability to live my life as a changed person.

Sometimes when we're trying to make some personal changes, reaching out to friends and others for support can be very helpful. That's also one of the benefits of personal counseling. The Lutheran Counseling Center is here for that purpose. Feel free to reach out to us with any need you have and help for your personal growth.

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the Magi, or wise men (who were Gentiles), came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

LESSONS IN WISE FAITH

"The Magi teach us true faith," said Martin Luther. Given the obstacles they encountered, we would understand if they had given up altogether!

First, the travelers were "off the mark," coming to Jerusalem to seek a newborn king in a "royal palace." Then, directed to Bethlehem, the wise men found a sight "so utterly out of keeping with a king" — a poor young woman and child, in a "poor hut" — that one might expect them to head straight home. "But," declares Luther, "with a great, strong and full faith they ... follow the word of the prophet and the witness of the star in all purity of heart," bowing to worship and honor the Savior.
