

Dear Members and Friends,

March 2024

On Sunday, February 11 we celebrated the Transfiguration of Our Lord. Following worship, we enjoyed a special time of fellowship before the Lenten fast. Special thanks to those who provided delicious waffles, ice cream, fruit, brownies, and fun for all. In Lent we prepare our hearts for delving deeper into repentance and reflection, as we remember the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Ashes. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, when a cross of ashes is placed on the foreheads of parishioners as a sign that we are dust and to dust we shall return. But Lent reminds us that our bodies will one day be raised with Christ on the Last Day.

The color purple. Paraments, banners, stoles, slide backgrounds and other times in the church are purple during Lent. Purple is connected to sorrowing and suffering over sin. The Bible tells us that Jesus wore a purple robe when he was mocked by the soldiers and crowned with thorns just hours before his death on the cross (John 10:2).

Forty days. The season of Lent lasts forty days leading up to the celebration of Easter Sunday. Forty is an important number in the Bible, associated with times of suffering, patience, and temptation. Therefore, Lent is a time to recognize the suffering our sin has caused, patiently wait for heaven through the sacrifice of Christ, and resist the temptations of the devil.

Little Easters. The forty days of Lent do not count the Sundays in the season. They are considered "little Easters" when we remember that the resurrection of Christ occurred on a Sunday.

Penance, Fasting and Almsgiving. The Church has encouraged certain practices in Lent. Penance means acknowledging our personal sins to God. Fasting involves putting away anything that pulls our

attention away from Christ. Almsgiving gives us a chance to selflessly offer something of ourselves to aid others.

Springtime. It is no coincidence that Lent occurs in the spring. The word *Lent* comes from the Old English *lencten*, meaning "springtime." Spiritually speaking, Lent is also a time for us to grow and be renewed in our Faith in Christ.

Somber music. Hymnody during the season of Lent is often and intentionally written in mournfulsounding minor keys. The word *alleluia* is removed from all sung lyrics in many churches during Lent, making the return of alleluias in song on Easter even more powerful and joyous.

I wish you a meaningful Lent. May God bless us as we grow in our relationship with the Lord. I look forward to seeing you at worship.

The Fourth Trimester and Beyond Navigating Postpartum Life By Eden Althaus, LCSW



A few years ago, as I awaited the birth of my first child, like most expectant moms, I investigated and prepared for any and every aspect of taking care of a baby that I could think of. At the top of my list was sleep training. After multiple virtual training courses and extensive research on sound machines, black-out blinds, and nighttime routines, I adopted the notion that with the right environment and support, a baby could be taught to sleep early on. And when my first daughter started sleeping through the night at six weeks

old, I was pretty convinced that I could get any baby to sleep this soundly. I was feeling very confident as a first-time mom.

Just sixteen months later, my second child was born, and I was very quickly humbled. My new daughter had reflux for the first nine months of her life and could not be laid down flat to sleep. My so-called formula for perfect sleep was disproven and I was at a loss. I remember feeling overwhelmed by a variety of emotions, many negative. Those beginning months were vastly different from the postpartum experience I had with my first. My expectations were not aligning with my reality, which landed me feeling like a failure and, sadly, disconnected from my sweet baby girl.

I began to reach out to other mothers I knew for guidance and reflection. As I listened to their experiences, I felt comfort in acknowledging that sometimes mothering can be undeniably difficult. While inspiring gratitude for the most beautiful blessing that God could ever give us, new motherhood can also be isolating and completely overwhelming. Opposite feelings can exist simultaneously and its okay; moreover, it doesn't make one a "bad mom." This revelation helped me reconnect with my daughter and form a deeper bond.

Researcher Brittany Chambers said, "Let go of what you thought motherhood would be like and be present to the unfolding of what actually is." I found her beautiful instructive words profound, and I continue to attempt this each day. It is a process, a journey. But one, I've learned, I am not alone in. Postpartum mental health may be a term that is being utilized more frequently today than ever before, but there is much more to learn and talk about... and most importantly, normalize. The portrayals of motherhood in the media are inaccurate and add to the unrealistic expectations new moms set for themselves. The challenges of pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum life are very real and are experienced differently by every individual.

I recently took the Maternal Mental Health Intensive Training through the Seleni Institute and learned that 85% of women experience significant emotional distress during or after pregnancy. Furthermore, 15–20% of childbearing women experience diagnosable Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders (PMADs.) PMAD is the most common complication in pregnancy, surpassing preterm labor, gestational diabetes, and low birthweight. It is time to recognize that these disorders are common and treatable. They should be talked about and normalized so mothers can feel better supported and, in turn, more likely to seek help.

So, whether you are a new mom or a seasoned one, if you find yourself struggling, give yourself some grace, and know that you do not have to go through these challenges alone. The Lutheran Counseling Center is always here to help. Matthew 28:20 reminds us, "... And be sure of this: I am with you always..." Above all else, remember God is holding all of us and will guide us through all of life's challenges, the fourth trimester and beyond.

She has certification in PAIRS (Practical Applications for Intimate Relationship Skills) and in Prepare Enrich for couples. In addition, Eden is trained in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, SafeTALK Suicide Prevention and in motivational interviewing. Eden has a passion for maternal mental health and is currently continuing her education through the Seleni Institute's Maternal Mental Health Intensive course online.

Mrs. Althaus currently counsels adolescents, adults, and couples via secure, virtual Telehealth.
