RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD, EASTER DAY

A Happy Beginning

There's a way of talking about Easter that makes it sound a bit like a surprise happy ending that brings a scary and suspenseful storyline to its resolution. On one level that's true: Easter is a day of joy! Death is defeated! It is the feast of victory of our God.

But if we think of Easter only as the final chapter in God's story of salvation, we may leave Easter Sunday worship the same way we leave a movie theater after a satisfying film: we take a deep breath, we let out a sigh perhaps, we say, "Well, that was great," and then we go back to our everyday lives. We go back to our grief. We go back to our fear about the future. We go back to a world where evil still seems to win.

Easter is something different entirely. Easter is not a momentary interruption in the general order of things, a temporary reprieve from the heaviness of death. Far from wrapping things up or simply undoing the pain of Good Friday, the resurrection of Jesus Christ opens up a whole new way of living. It is not a "sigh" but an earthquake!

"But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them," Luke writes (24:11). It takes time for the full magnitude of the empty tomb to settle in. Like the apostles upon hearing the women's news, we can scarcely imagine what it means for us that God's love is stronger than death, and that every aspect of our life together—indeed, the entire cosmos!—is changed by this good news. That's why the church gives us fifty days to unpack this mystery, not just a single morning.

But one thing is for sure: Easter is not a happy ending so much as it is a new beginning. We who are baptized into Jesus Christ are free to live with death in the rearview mirror, no longer afraid of its power.

Burnout in the Workplace

At LCC's Annual Corporators' meeting on March 12th, Dr. Betty Geiling presented on the timely topic of "Burnout in the Workplace" with a special emphasis on the church and our church workers. Here are a few highlights:

Burnout is a syndrome or cluster of symptoms leading to emotional, physical, and mental exhaustion. Over the long term it can have devastating consequences for our health. Eventually causing exhaustion, memory loss, and lack of empathy for those we serve.

This has been the focus of much research over the past decades, with the goal of getting people back to work, developing effective treatments, and avoiding the conditions in the workplace that make us particularly vulnerable.



- Pastors, church workers, clinicians and caregivers are susceptible to burnout because they tend to be less vocal about their circumstances regarding the stress they are experiencing.
- Pastors and church workers engage in the service of others and "one way giving" which can lead to compassion fatigue.
- Caregiving professions are regularly called on to provide comfort in the midst of crisis.

We are designed to endure a healthy amount of stress from our daily tasks and environment. When balance exists, this feels energizing and results in productive work. As the inability to cope with daily stressors escalates, we begin to experience uncomfortable symptoms and difficult days in our workplace.

Effective ways to avoid burnout begin with regular check-in's regarding our own self-care. As church professionals, it is important to remember that we use ourselves as the "tool kit" to serve others. And, in order for us to be effective, we too need a "tool kit" for ourselves.

Some ways to avoid burnout involve a solid, predictable routine involving adequate sleep, limited technology exposure, exercise, learning to say "no," and surrounding ourselves with positive, supportive people/colleagues. Lastly, take care of your spiritual health by allowing sufficient time for prayer and reading the Word.
